The THEMES for each of the 3 school levels are as follows:

Elementary Schools:

Love, Joy and Happiness with Friends or Family.

Junior Schools:

A Clean and Green Environment.

High Schools:

The Dream of a Young Filipino.

Artwork must be done on thick paper, card board, art board or mounted canvas. Sizes: Letter (8 x 11.0"), 12" x 16" or 15" x 20", vertical format preferred.

Time line

DATE	ACTIVITY
JANUARY 31 - APRIL 21, 2023	Participants will produce their unaided, original artwork during non-school hours.
April 21, 2023	Schools to start collecting the artwork for judgment per school level.
April 22 - May 10, 2023	School may select their 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners.
May 16, 2023	Each school is to turn in their three winners to SDO Angeles City between 2:00 and 4:00 pm, and RCCC is to collect the submissions at 4:30 pm.
June 17, 2023	Awarding Ceremony

Mechanics For Schools



- The 2023 Children's Art Competition for Elementary, Junior, and Senior High Schools in Angeles City by the Rotary Club of Clark Centennial (RCCC) will be held as a voluntary out-of-school hours activity for all pupils.
- The Schools Division of Angeles City will release the advisory of the mechanics and additional instructions to the schools including timeline and the theme
- Each school will select the first, second, and third place winner to represent their school in the final competition.
- Winning paintings and drawings are to be submitted to DepEd Division Angeles City; RCCC will
 collect all the artworks for final judgement by prominent local artists for Angeles City's First,
 Second, and Third winners from among all the Elementary, Junior, and Senior High School
 entries.
- These nine finalists will receive gift certificates during the awarding ceremony. First place will receive P5,000, second place P3,000, and third place P2,000.
- In recognition of each school's winners, an award certificate will be issued for each winner, and the winning schools will also receive award certificates.
- Upon submission, to RCCC the artwork becomes the property of RCCC. If any are sold, the
 proceeds will be divided 50% to the pupil, 25% to the school, and 25% to RCCC. The pupil and
 school will receive their shares as gift vouchers from a prominent art/scholastic materials
 supplier.
- Each piece of artwork shall have a label affixed on the back with the name of the school, the
 artist's name, age, and a contact number printed or written clearly so that the artist can be
 credited on any promotional material and press releases.
