Participation of students shall be purely voluntarily and should not hamper instructional time, in compliance with the provisions of DepEd No. 22, s. 2023 titled "Implementing Guidelines on the School Calendar and Activities for the School Year 2023-2024," DepEd Order No. 66 s. 2017 titled "Implementing Guidelines on the Conduct of Off-Campus Activities and DepEd Order No. 9, s. 2005 titled "Instituting Measures to Increased Engaged Time-on- Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith."

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I. RATIONALE

Functional Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committees (BDRRMCs) and the School Disaster Risk Reduction & Management Boards (SDRRMBs) are very important in preparing the people in the eventuality on a negative incident and in the face of climate change. These committees serve as the primary body in formulating and implementing appropriate program, activities and projects (PAPs) that would raise the preparedness of their constituents and abate potential risk in their communities and schools.

The creation of DRRM committees in barangays is provided in RA 10121 otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management System Act. Aside from RA 1021, the Local Government Code of the Philippines mandates barangays to craft and pursue measures that would protect the lives of the public and safeguard the environment.

The conduct of this program is aid to encourage barangays to put priority on disaster prevention and preparedness and emphasis the importance of cooperation and collaboration between and among public and private sectors. Further, the Rescue Olympics recognize the efforts and best practices of communities on the field of disaster risk reduction and management.

II. PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- 1. Strengthen the institutionalization of community-based DRRM formations;
- Ensure that DRRM Programs are considered in the community planning and budgeting processes;
- 3. Encourage community-based DRRM Committees/Boards to implement sound and appropriate climate change mitigation and adaptation PAPs,
- 4. Recognize the best practices made by barangays and schools on the disaster risk reduction and management program; and
- 5. To capacitate the First Responders to preparedness and safety in the community and school.

III. EVENT MECHANICS

- 1. The Olympics will be open to all Barangay and School Rescue Teams in the city.
- 2. The Following are the Category to be played during the said Olympics:
 - a) Bandaging Relay
 - b) Lifting and Moving Relay
 - c) Situational Analysis Focus on Immobilization, Control Bleeding and Bandaging

- Participant must complete a 1-day Standard First Aid and Basic Life Support Training.
- 5. Participant will be trained by a Certified and Licensed First Aid Provider and Basic Life Support prior to the event as part of the preparation for the Olympics.
- 6. Each team must be composed of 7 members regardless of their age (16-40 years) and gender. (Only 5 members will be allowed to play in every event).
 - a) 7 players 5 players, 1 reserve and 1 victim
 - b) Physically fit to join the event
- 7. Victim for the Bandaging and Lifting & Moving Relays should come from one of the members of the participating team (minimum weight is 50 kg. or 110lbs) Extra clothing must be provided to the participant posing as the victim (REQUIRED).

IV. OLYMPICS RULES and REGULATIONS

- 1. The chosen members of ACDRRMO will prepare problems/scenarios.
- 2. Only Five (5) members of the team including the team leader will be allowed to play in any event or situation.
- 3. A maximum of ten (10) minutes will be allowed for a team to perform each event/problem.
- 4. A whistle or a louder signal will be used to signify the start and end of each hit. There will be a maximum of five (5) minutes interval between hits.
- 5. Unruly or misbehaved teams will be disqualified from the event where they are caught or not following instructions or arguing with each other.
- 6. Coaches/Trainers and/or any non-competing team members are to stay outside the designated competition area (Complete Isolation of all Participating Teams).
- 7. Coaching through any means of transmittal is also a ground for disqualification of a team for the particular event where coaching is caught.
- 8. For accurate and fair judging, two (2) committee members from DOH R3 will be assigned to each event or scenario. Another timer will be assigned to keep track of the team (10) minutes time for each hit.
- 9. The team with the best time (Shortest time to finish) will be given two (2) points bonus in all events.
- 10. Comments and suggestions are welcome for future competition consideration. If possible or necessary.

- 11. The teams which garnered the highest score/points per category will be declared champion, Second highest -1^{st} runner up, third highest -2^{nd} runner up and fourth highest -3^{rd} runner up.
- 12. The decision the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.
- 13. Members of the Competition Committee have nothing to do with decision of the judges of the competition.
