The overall champion will be determined through a point system. The breakdown of points is as follows:

**ACADEMIC QUIZ**  
Junior High School

1. Participants must be bona fide Junior High School students of the Academic Year 2024-2025.
2. Participants must be in their prescribed school uniform with ID during the contest proper.
3. There shall be a maximum of five (5) contestants per school. For every round, the team must be composed of (3) students from at least two (2) different grade levels; the other two (2) will serve as alternates.
4. The questions shall cover topics in Mathematics, Science, Filipino, Literature, History, General Information, and Current Events.
5. Each question will only be read **once** by the quizmaster.
6. The quizmaster shall announce the number of seconds allotted to answer a question. The time allotment will depend on the question's nature and level of difficulty. The timer starts after the signal (Go!). After the time limit, the answer sheets will immediately be collected by the ushers, failure to submit the answer sheet on time will invalidate the answer of the team.
7. Answers that require computations should be written with the appropriate units indicated in the question. The final answer must be rounded off to the number of decimal places indicated in the stem of the question. Answers with incorrect or no units or those not rounded off to the correct decimal places will be considered incorrect.
8. As the question is being read, groups can start solving and/or may proceed to write their answers on the answer sheets.
9. Mobile devices and calculators are not allowed during the contest. The use of such devices will result in the team's disqualification.
10. Answers that are proper nouns shall be written starting with a capital letter. Failure to capitalize the first letter of a proper noun will render the answer incorrect.
11. If the answer is a name of a person the relevant parts of the name will be indicated on the question.
12. Only duly registered coaches and team captains are allowed to appeal within the given time. Doing so, the appealing party should present their sources within three (3) minutes. Two (2) green flags will be given to each competing team, 1 for the coach and 1 for the team captain, which can be raised if an appeal is to be made. Electronic sources shall only be considered if the site is an academic reference or journal, peer-reviewed material, organization site, online newspaper, etc. **NO COMPLAINT SHALL BE ENTERTAINED AFTER A NEW QUESTION HAS BEEN GIVEN.**
13. Substitution shall only be allowed at the end of each round.
14. The contest shall consist of the following categories with the corresponding points for every correct answer.

EASY ROUND	5 Questions	2 points
AVERAGE ROUND	5 Questions	5 points
DIFFICULT ROUND	5 Questions	10 points



15. After every round, the accumulated points will be totaled. After the last round, the teams will be ranked to award the following:

16. In case of ties, clincher questions will be given to break the tie on a sudden death basis.

**ACADEMIC QUIZ**  
Senior High School

1. Participants must be bona fide Junior High School students of the Academic Year 2024-2025.
2. Participants must be in their prescribed school uniform with ID during the contest proper.
3. There shall be a maximum of five (5) contestants per school. For every round, the team must be composed of three (3) students from Grades 11 and 12; the other two (2) will serve as alternates. If a regular contestant is unable to compete, the alternate contestant shall take his/her place.
4. The questions shall cover topics in Mathematics (General Mathematics, Statistics, and Probability), Sciences (Earth and Life Science, and Physical Science), Language (Oral Communication, Komunikasyon at Pananaliksik sa Wika at Kulturang Pilipino, and Pagbasa at Pagsusuri ng Iba't Ibang Teksto Tungo sa Pananaliksik), Humanities (21st Century Literature from the Philippines and the world), Social Science (Understanding Culture, Society and Politics), Philosophy (Introduction to Philosophy of the Human Person) and General Knowledge including Current Events.
5. Each question will only be read **once** by the quizmaster.
6. The quizmaster shall announce the number of seconds allotted to answer a question. The time allotment will depend on the question's nature and level of difficulty. The timer starts after the signal (Go!). After the time limit, the answer sheets will immediately be collected by the ushers, failure to submit the answer sheet on time will invalidate the answer of the team.
7. Answers that require computations should be written with the appropriate units indicated in the question. The final answer must be rounded off to the number of decimal places indicated in the stem of the question. Answers with incorrect or no units or those not rounded off to the correct decimal places will be considered incorrect.

**SONGFEST**

Junior/Senior High School

1. Participation in the Songfest is open to all bona fide junior and senior high school students.
2. Each participating school may designate one pair of representatives, regardless of gender or grade level (Junior and/or Senior High School).
3. The contest piece must be a duet song. Medleys are strictly prohibited.
4. Participants must submit their minus one audio track to the organizers at least one week prior to the competition. Multiplex tracks are not permitted.
5. Contestants are required to wear attire that aligns with the theme and mood of their chosen song. Clothing deemed inappropriate or excessively revealing is strictly prohibited.
6. The criteria for judging are as follows:

<b>VOICE QUALITY</b>	<b>35%</b>
<b>MUSICALITY</b> <i>(timing, melody, mastery, dynamics, and harmony)</i>	<b>35%</b>
<b>DICTION</b> <i>(clear, distinct, correct, enunciation)</i>	<b>20%</b>
<b>STAGE PRESENCE</b>	<b>10%</b>
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>100%</b>

7. Winners will be determined by the ranking of their scores and awarded as follows:

**DANCEFEST (Modern Dance)**

Junior/Senior High School

1. The group should consist of 10 to 12 members, exclusively composed of bona fide Junior and/or Senior High School students, aged 12 to 19 years old. In the event of a member's absence due to medical or health reasons, the committee must be notified in advance.
2. The performance time should not be less than 2 minutes and not be more than 3 minutes. There will be an allotment of extra 90 seconds for the entrance and exit.
3. A penalty of two points will be deducted from the average score for any performance that exceeds or falls short of the allotted time. Any fraction of a minute will be treated as a full minute.
4. The type of music must be modern dances, except modern ballet, modern jazz, and ballroom.
5. The use of fireworks and props is prohibited. Groups failing to comply will be disqualified. Background video graphics are permitted but must be submitted to the organizers at least one week prior to the competition.
6. Suggestive or lewd movements and costumes are strictly prohibited. A wholesome performance is highly encouraged. A one-point deduction from the total average score will be imposed on any group failing to adhere to these guidelines.
7. The criteria for judging are as follows:

<b>CONCEPT</b> <i>(choreography, costume, props, and music)</i>	<b>25%</b>
<b>SKILL &amp; TECHNIQUE</b> <i>(musicality, dance techniques, and mastery of style)</i>	<b>25%</b>
<b>CREATIVITY</b> <i>(elements and use of space)</i>	<b>25%</b>
<b>PERFORMANCE &amp; EXECUTION</b> <i>(synchronization, precision, and showmanship)</i>	<b>25%</b>
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>100%</b>
