GUIDELINES OF THE DIFFERENT CONTESTS

1. SPOKEN POETRY IN FILIPINO

Guidelines:

- 1. Spoken poetry is a performance that is word-based. It is spoken or recited with emotion. It is an oral art that focuses on the art of word play, rhythm, improvisation, intonation, and voice inflection.
- 2. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Pampanga.
- 3. Only one participant is allowed per school.
- 4. The piece/composition must be related to the theme: "Act Now for a Peaceful World."
- 5. The spoken poetry piece must be an original composition, in Filipino.
- 6. The spoken poetry must be delivered from memory within 3-5 minutes. Deduction of 1 point from the total scores will be done for extended minutes.
- 7. Appropriate sound/music must be used (may be original music). Videos may not use copyrighted music. No profanities or inappropriate language should be used.
- 8. Appropriate appearance/clothing or gestures should be used. Prescribed school uniform is not allowed.
- 9. Sounds, instruments, or musical background is allowed to complement the delivery. No deduction shall be made if the contestant opts not to have a musical background.
- 10. Announcement of results and awarding of winners is on September 19, 2025, in the afternoon during the Peace Education forum.
- 11. Three winners will be chosen and will receive medals and certificate of recognition. All participants will receive certificate of participation.
- 12. The decision of the judges shall be final and irrevocable.

Criteria:

- 1. Message/Content (40%) (must be relevant to the theme; has a powerful and meaningful message)
- 2. Delivery and Performance (30%) (delivered from the heart, facial expression, hand and body gestures emphasize the elements of the performance, enunciation is clear, appropriate costume)
- 3. Originality (20%) (original composition by the contestant)
- 4. Overall Impact (10%) (total success of the performance)
- 5. Total: 100%

Prizes:

1st Prize: gold medal and certificate of Recognition (contestant and coach)
2nd Prize: silver medal and certificate of Recognition (contestant and coach)
3rd Prize: bronze medal and certificate of recognition (contestant and coach)



2. EXTEMPORANEOUS SPEECH

Guidelines:

- 1. Extemporaneous speech is a type of public speaking that involves delivering a prepared but not memorized speech on a given topic. It is often used in academic, competitive, or professional settings, where speakers must present their arguments, opinions, or information in a clear and persuasive way.
- 2. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Pampanga.
- 3. Only one participant is allowed per school.
- 4. The piece/composition must be related to the theme: "Act Now for a Peaceful World."
- 5. The extemporaneous speech piece must be an original composition, in English.
- 6. The speech must be delivered from memory within 3-5 minutes. Deduction of 1 point from the total scores will be done for extended minutes.
- 7. Appropriate appearance/clothing or gestures should be used. School uniform is not allowed.
- 8. Announcement of results and awarding of winners is on September 19, 2025, in the afternoon during the Peace Education forum.
- 9. Three winners will be chosen and will receive medals and certificate of recognition. All participants will receive certificate of participation.
- 10. The decision of the judges shall be final and irrevocable.

Criteria:

- 1. Oral Delivery which includes grammar and usage, diction or word choice, intonation, enunciation, and vocal variety 30%
- 2. Physical Delivery which includes stance, use of gestures, facial expressions, eye contact, and stage presence 10%
- 3. Content which refers to clear main message, supporting examples, and outstanding speech value) 40%
- 4. Organization that means sound opening, body, and conclusion 20%
- 5. A total of 100%

Prizes:

1st Prize: gold medal and certificate of Recognition (contestant and coach)

2nd Prize: silver medal and certificate of Recognition (contestant and coach)

3rd Prize: bronze medal and certificate of recognition (contestant and coach)



3. ESSAY WRITING CONTEST IN ENGLISH AND FILIPINO

Guidelines:

- 1. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Pampanga.
- 2. Only one participant is allowed per school per category- 1 in English and 1 in Filipino.
- 3. The topic of the essay will be given during the contest.
- 4. The contestant must wear the prescribed school uniform with ID.
- 5. The contestant must bring black pen. Sheets of paper will be provided by the organizer.
- 6. The participant must be in the contest venue (SJH 203) 15 minutes before the contest proper.
- 7. Each contestant shall be assigned a number.
- 8. The contestants shall be given two (2) hours to develop the composition.
- 9. Announcement of results and awarding of winners is on September 19, 2025, in the afternoon during the Peace Education forum.
- 10. Three winners will be chosen and will receive medals and certificate of recognition. All participants will receive certificate of participation.
- 11. The decision of the judges shall be final and irrevocable.

Criteria:

1. Content (Relevance to the theme, Comprehensiveness, Originality, Insights)

50%

Relevance to the theme – connection, significance of the issue being discussed Comprehensiveness – how complete and detailed the writer's exposition of the topic.

Originality - uniqueness, novelty and authenticity of ideas

Insights – a fresh way of looking at things, critical view of the subject

2. Organization (Clarity of Thoughts, Creativity, Unity and Consistency)

30%

Clarity of Thoughts – use of simple and appropriate words to convey ideas or issues.

Creativity – the use of appropriate devices and expressions in the exposition of the subject.

Unity and Consistency – ability to highlight the focal point

3. Mechanics (Punctuation, Spelling, Capitalization, Grammar)

20%

the correct use of punctuation, capitalization and grammar

4. POSTER MAKING CONTEST

Guidelines:

- 1. The contest is open to all Grade 12 students in all schools (private and public) in Pampanga.
- 2. Only one participant is allowed per school.
- 3. The theme of the poster will be given during the contest.
- 4. The contestant must wear the prescribed school uniform with ID.
- 5. The contestant must bring their own preferred materials: ½ illustration board, pencil and coloring materials.
- 6. The participant must be in the contest venue (HAU Student Center) 15 minutes before the contest proper.
- 7. Each contestant shall be assigned a number.
- 8. The contestants shall be given five (5) hours to complete the poster.
- 9. Announcement of results and awarding of winners is on September 19, 2025, in the afternoon during the Peace Education forum.
- 10. Three winners will be chosen and will receive medals and certificate of recognition. All participants will receive certificate of participation.
- 11. The decision of the judges shall be final and irrevocable.

Criteria:

- 1. Interpretation/ Clarity of the theme 40%
- 2. Creativity and originality 30%
- 3. Quality of Artistic Composition 30%
- 4. Total 100%

Prizes:

1st Prize: gold medal and certificate of Recognition (contestant and coach)
2nd Prize: silver medal and certificate of Recognition (contestant and coach)
3rd Prize: bronze medal and certificate of recognition (contestant and coach)



5. ADVOCACY CAMPAIGN VIDEO MAKING CONTEST

Guidelines:

- 1. Participants must form a group of three (3) members who will perform production roles such as director, scriptwriter, and production assistant. Other students may help as actors but only those with production roles are considered as contestants. Only one (1) entry per school will be accepted.
- 2. All entries must be a 3–5-minute video; either a documentary, short film, audio visual campaign or an infomercial, about fighting inequality, climate change and violation of human rights. Video materials should be taken using mobile phones only.
- 3. The video format should be mp4.
- 4. All entries must be original, unpublished online or in any other media platform, and has not been submitted to any other contest/s. Songs and musical scoring should have no copyright infringement.
- 5. All entries must be emailed together with the registration form at cmtimbol.edukcouncil@gmail.com on or before September 07, 2025 using the following email subject format: (title of the entry), name of school. Example: Peace Bro, Holy Angel University.
- 6. Announcement of results and awarding of winners is on September 19, 2025 in the afternoon during the Peace Education forum.
- 7. Three winners will be chosen and will receive medals and certificate of recognition. All participants will receive certificate of participation.
- 8. The decision of the judges shall be final and irrevocable.

Criteria:

- 1. Relevance to the theme 35%
- 2. Storyline 35%
- 3. Creativity / Execution 30%
- 4. Total 100%

Prizes:

1st Prize: gold medal and certificate of Recognition (contestant and coach)
2nd Prize: silver medal and certificate of Recognition (contestant and coach)
3rd Prize: bronze medal and certificate of recognition (contestant and coach)

6. TED TALK

- 1. Each contestant is required to present a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 5-minute TED talk with the topic: Cultivating a Culture of Peace.
- 2. The TED Talk will be held in the afternoon of September 20, 2024, after the Peace Forum.
- 3. The content of the TED Talk, memorized and delivered in English, should focus on strategies for fostering a culture of peace within individuals, families, schools, communities, and society as a whole.
- 4. The TED talk piece must be submitted to **cmtimbol.edukcouncil@gmail.com** on or before September 15, 2025, with the following format:

- 5. The contestant is allowed to use visual aids such as PowerPoint presentation for emphasis and clarity of message.
- 6. The organizing committee will extend their assistance on the setting up of PowerPoint presentation.
- 7. Utilizing pictures and videos are allowed as long as there is provision for proper credits.
- 8. The provided projector and white screen in the venue will be used.
- 9. Criteria for judging are as follows:
