Barangay & School DRRM Committees (B/SDRRMCs)

-  1. **ORIENTATION** – on the GP Guidelines and Assessment Checklist
-  2. **SELF ASSESSMENT** – of the B/SDRRMCs
-  3. **BDRRMC DESK EVALUATION** – City Desk Evaluation
-  4. **FIELD VALIDATION** – secondary data review
-  5. **DELIBERATION** – of awardees
-  6. **AWARDING** – GP Awarding Ceremony

Self-Assessment of Barangay & DRRMCs

- The Barangay and School DRRMCs, prior to the conduct of the actual assessment, shall perform an **honest assessment of their respective DRRMCs** through a **self-assessment** rating using the prescribed DRRMCs' Checklist. The DRRMCs are also encouraged to **maximize the Remarks Column to support their self-assessment rating**.
- The DRRMCs shall **accomplish the said checklist** and attach the necessary documents as **means of verification (MOV)** in the prescribed format, and submit them **to Angeles City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (ACDRRMO)**. **Submission shall be no later than the prescribed deadline set by the ACDRRMO.**
- The ACDRRMO shall issue a **Certificate of Participation** to all DRRMCs who have complied with the submission of the said documents within the prescribed timeline.
- DRRMCs who **fail to submit** any of the necessary documents **shall be disqualified** from the assessment.
