**RECOMMENDED LEARNERS' GOVERNMENT ACTIVITIES FOR NATIONAL
TEACHERS' DAY CELEBRATION 2025**

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent
Chief Education Supervisors
Heads of Public Elementary and Secondary Schools
All Others Concerned

1. Pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 242, s. 2011 and Republic Act No. 10743, the Department of Education joins the nation in celebrating **National Teachers' Day (NTD)** from **September 5 to October 5**, to recognize the invaluable role of teachers in nation-building and to honor their commitment and dedication to education and holistic learner development.

2. In line with this, and in support of learner-led initiatives that promote values of respect, gratitude, and active participation in civic life, the **Supreme Elementary Learners' Government (SELG)** and the **Supreme Secondary Learners' Government (SSLG)** are enjoined to spearhead school-based activities in celebration of National Teachers' Day.

3. The following are **recommended activities** to be planned, initiated, and implemented by SELG and SSLG in collaboration with their respective teacher-advisers and class officers:

1. Opening Program / Kick-Off Ceremony

- o To formally commence the National Teachers' Day celebration, a **synchronized bell-ringing** will be conducted across all public elementary and secondary schools on **September 5, 2025 at 9:05 AM**.
- o To be followed by short but meaningful flag ceremony dedicated to teachers, featuring **recitation of the "Teachers' Prayer"**, either led by a designated learner or played over the public address system and **messages of gratitude from learner representatives**.

2. Teachers' Day Parade

- o A vibrant and symbolic procession organized to publicly honor and celebrate the invaluable contributions of our educators





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3. “Wall of Gratitude”, Freedom Board”, or “Message Tree”

- A display area or creative installation where students can post handwritten notes, letters, or artworks expressing appreciation for their teachers.

4. “Tribute to Teachers” Program

- A cultural program showcasing student talents through songs, spoken poetry, short skits, or dances dedicated to teachers.
- May include surprise video messages or short documentaries about selected teachers’ impact.

5. “Thank You, Teacher!” Video Presentation

- A compilation of messages or scrapbooks from students across grade levels, expressing their admiration and stories of how teachers have inspired them.

6. Teacher Appreciation Cards or Tokens

- Creative handmade cards, bookmarks, or simple personalized tokens crafted by learners and class organizations.

7. “A Day of Service”

- Organized student-led assistance to teachers, including activities such as decorating classrooms, arranging learning materials, managing classroom routines, and providing wellness services like massage, spa treatments, haircuts, manicures, and pedicures.

8. Teacher Raffle Draw / Fun Games

- Light and joyful segments facilitated by the supreme learner government where teachers can participate and receive small prizes.

9. Social Media Campaign (with approval of school heads and proper data privacy considerations)

- Posting student messages and short features about teachers using hashtags such as #ThankYouTeacher, #MyTeacherMyHero, and #DepEdNTD2025.

10. Personalized “Teacher Awards”

- Fun and thoughtful awards such as “Most Approachable Teacher,” “Classroom Innovator,” or “Most Inspiring Educator,” based on student nominations.

4. The following are the guidelines for implementation:

- Activities must be aligned with DepEd policies and school safety protocols.



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- Learner-led initiatives must be inclusive, respectful, and non-discriminatory.
- The planning and implementation should foster student leadership, creativity, and values formation.
- Coordination with school heads, GPTA, and teacher-advisers is required for logistical and moral support.
- Any financial requirements must be minimal and voluntary; no collection from students is allowed.

5. All SELG and SSLG officers, with the support of their advisers, are encouraged to exhibit leadership and initiative in organizing meaningful activities that will honor our teachers' unwavering dedication and service.

6. For guidance and monitoring, a brief post-activity report with photos and documentation should be submitted to the Division office on or before **October 10, 2025**.
