

- 1. Within the MATATAG Curriculum, literacy is positioned as a fundamental pillar, with instruction commencing in the early grades. The approach is grounded in explicit, evidence-based methodologies—including phonics, sight word acquisition, and pragmatic language use—to build robust reading and communication abilities. These skills are systematically developed and strategically integrated into all subject areas, creating a coherent and cumulative framework that underpins student comprehension and academic success across the curriculum.

 - a. demonstrate explicit, evidence-based literacy instruction strategy—specifically in phonics, vocabulary development, and fluency—and to equip them with strategies for immediate integration into their daily lesson;
 - b. draft sample assessment literacy tools for identifying students' learning gaps, thereby enabling them to tailor differentiated instruction and intervention strategies to meet diverse learner needs; and
 - c. formulate a collaborative analysis of the MATATAG Curriculum's literacy strand and instructional practices across subjects to create a cohesive and reinforcing learning experience for students.
- 4. Participants to this seminar are key stage 1 teachers. Untrained key stage 1 teachers are highly recommended to join this seminar to capacitate them on the implementation of the *Matatag* Curriculum.
- 5. The travel expenses of participants shall be charged against the school MOOE or local funds subject to usual auditing and accounting rules and regulations.




