1. **CONDUCT OF THE END OF SCHOOL YEAR (EOSY) ASSESSMENT
UNDER PROJECT INSIGHT**

To : Assistant Regional Director

1. In reference to Regional Memorandum No. 221, s. 2025 titled *Implementing Guidelines of Project INSIGHT (Innovative System for Gauging Holistic Teaching and Learning)* and Regional Memorandum No. 232, s. 2025 titled *Additional Guidelines on the Implementation of Project INSIGHT*, this Office hereby issues guidance on the conduct of the End of School Year (EOSY) Assessment, formerly referred to as the Second Testing Window, for Grades 3 and 11 learners.
2. The EOSY Assessment aims to generate consolidated learner performance data, analyze learning progress and persistent competency gaps from the Beginning of School Year (BOSY) Assessment, and use assessment results as key evidence for instructional planning and the development and refinement of the 5-Year Competency Development Plan for cities and municipalities.
3. Following the BOSY Assessment, schools and Schools Division Offices were advised to initiate and sustain appropriate school-based and division-led interventions, including the continued implementation of the ARAL Program for identified learners. The EOSY Assessment shall serve as a validation and monitoring mechanism to determine the effectiveness of these locally implemented interventions.
4. The conduct of the EOSY Assessment shall follow three phases: preparation, testing, and results consolidation. The **preparation phase** shall be conducted from **February 16 to 20, 2026**, the **EOSY testing window** from **February 23 to March 13, 2026**, and the **results consolidation phase** from **March 13 to 20, 2026**. The assessment shall cover learners in Grades 3 and 11 from participating schools. Schools shall ensure that assessment administration across all phases adheres to the procedures and logistical arrangements previously implemented during the BOSY Assessment.



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5. To maximize the use of Project INSIGHT, Schools Division Offices are encouraged to facilitate the use of existing Project INSIGHT access codes for schools that are not part of the official sample, subject to technical readiness and resource availability. This measure aims to support broader school-level and division-level instructional diagnosis and planning.

6. Assessment results generated by non-sample schools shall be used exclusively for internal school and division purposes, including instructional improvement, identification of learning gaps, and inputs to local competency development initiatives. These results shall not form part of the regional-level analysis or official reporting, which shall remain based on the approved sample schools in accordance with existing guidelines.

7. All EOSY Assessment results shall be accessed, consolidated, and used by schools and Schools Division Offices through the Project INSIGHT platform. Results shall be used strictly for instructional improvement, planning, and monitoring purposes, and shall not be used for ranking or punitive actions.

9. To prepare for the EOSY Assessment, the Regional Project INSIGHT Core Team shall lead all coordination and logistical planning activities. This primary coordinating body comprises the Regional Testing Coordinator, the Regional Technical Working Group, 21 Division Testing Coordinators, 21 Division Information Technology Officers (ITOs), and 130 designated School Testing Coordinators, one per city or municipality in Region III.

10. A **virtual coordination meeting** shall be conducted on **February 18, 2026**, from **8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.** to review assessment schedules, testing procedures, and platform access, and to clarify roles and responsibilities in the conduct of the EOSY Assessment. The meeting link shall be emailed to all identified participants. The list of the Project INSIGHT Regional Core Team is enclosed in this Memorandum for reference and guidance.

7. During all phases of the EOSY Assessment, the Regional Technical Working Group (TWG), Schools Division Office personnel, and the 130 designated School Testing Coordinators shall provide monitoring and technical assistance to their respective jurisdictions. This support shall cover assessment preparation, platform troubleshooting, and administration oversight. To ensure effective delivery of these activities, designated personnel may travel on official business to their assigned divisions, cities, municipalities, and schools.



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8. Travel and other related expenses incurred in the conduct of these activities may be charged to the Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) of the respective office or station, or to available local funds, subject to existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
9. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
